

a note from the playwright

I wrote this play to see what would happen if I stopped pretending I was okay. Back then, I was learning that penguins mate for life and I was wondering if I might be too queer to survive monogamy, or the apocalypse.

Honestly I didn't mean to write about penguins, or zookeepers, or the slow drip of extinction. I thought I was writing about love. And then loss. And then I realized maybe they're the same thing, just measured with different rituals.

Rituals that make me ask time and time again: What does survival look like when no one else is watching?

Not the kind I post about. Not the kind that could earn me applause. But the quiet kind. The kind where we molt in the dark and pray our feathers come back. The kind where we sing to an ex who abandoned us. The kind where we choose to love, with our scabs of rage, anyway.

Sometimes survival isn't a whole huge thing. It's a flicker. A feather. A coupon you forgot to use. But there's something holy in the trying. Don't you think? In showing up-- broken for sure, but still beautiful-- in the middle of what feels impossible.

This production with Truepenny, the Voxel & the entire company has reminded me that survival is also the performance we offer our four billion year old mother... night after night.

I hope this play reminds you of something soft that you almost forgot. Or something wild that you haven't let loose in a long time.

Let's see what survives?


