

PLAYWRIGHTS NOTE

During my fourth year at UMBC, I discovered a way to alleviate all the big feelings a twitchy 22-year-old college Acting major experiences daily. Three words: Write. It. Down. So, I did, ferociously, and it helped me tap into previously unexplored memories, ideas, and traumas – things I had buried or let pass me by. I wrote about my mom a lot – she passed away unexpectedly in 2007. In the spring of 2015, I was given a writing prompt exercise in playwriting class. I thought of my mom as I scribbled a short story about two dolphins rescuing a drowning woman from the ocean, smiling bittersweetly as I described the dolphins bringing her back to land and laying her gently on the beach. Couldn't some pair of benevolent sea creatures find my mom and bring her back? Where is she if she isn't here? In time, my explorations of these questions collided with my undying creative need to be wacky, and SQUIDSBURY was born, a play much about "going home." SQUIDS is a goodbye to my mom, as well as a testament to the village of undeniably strong women that helped raise me. It is directly inspired by these forever- cherished loved ones - gritty, adaptable, hardworking matriarchs.
